“Within hours, the Foundation said they could help. It was such a relief,” recalled Mariya Lovishchuk. The Front Street Clinic became a special project under the Juneau Health Field of Interest Fund and immediately began receiving contributions.

Connecting current needs to donors

“The Community Foundation quickly brought this issue to some of its donor advisors, who in turn recommended donations to the clinic. The Foundation and the community came together to make sure we could keep the doors open while the clinic was set up as its own non-profit,” said Dr. Carl Heine.

“People understood the importance of the Front Street Clinic to our less advantaged populations and wanted to support it. Luckily, the Foundation provided an easy way for them to give.”

Standing ready

There will always be funding emergencies like the Front Street Clinic’s 2013 crisis that need to be triaged. The **Juneau Health Field of Interest Fund** aims to build a pooled endowment to assist in supporting a healthy community.

The committee develops investment policies, oversees investments and management of all funds, and prepares the annual operating budget.

2013 Financial Highlights


EVERGREEN FUND

The Evergreen Fund is invested for the long term. The Foundation invests in stock markets in mature economies and accepts financial market volatility in the short term to achieve higher returns over a longer investment period. In 2013, the Evergreen Fund's performance benefitted substantially from this approach. Driven by strong returns in the global equity markets, the Evergreen Fund earned 19.56%. For the trailing three years, the annualized return was 10.91%.



BEDROCK FUND

The short term and more conservatively managed Bedrock Fund suffered from two factors: historically low interest rates and the Federal Reserve Bank announcement that it would reduce its monthly bond purchasing program, driving bond values down. Investors in fixed income securities reacted negatively to the news. In 2013, the return for the Bedrock Fund was -0.15%. For the trailing three years, the annualized return was 0.17%.



Juneau Community Foundation Investment Philosophy

SIMPLE No complicated investment vehicles. By simplifying, we avoid monitoring complicated funds and lower our costs.

TRANSPARENT Invest in electronically traded funds designed to replicate the performance of broad markets.

EXPLAINABLE Invest in three funds that replicate the performance of broad market indices, maintaining diversity without being complicated.

PATIENT Invest for the long term and accept market volatility.


