Coeur Alaska Kensington Mine Juneau Grows Endowment for Juneau Students

Juneau, Alaska – The Juneau Community Foundation is pleased to share that Coeur Alaska raised over \$34,000 to support their [Coeur Alaska Kensington Mine Juneau Schools Endowment Fund](#). The funds were raised through the third annual Coeur Alaska Kensington Mine Silent Auction fundraiser held this spring. The annual event brings together Coeur Alaska employees and contractors to support Juneau’s K-12 student activities through creativity, generosity, and collaboration.

The silent auction featured an impressive and diverse collection of handcrafted items created by talented Coeur Alaska employees, along with generous donations from community partners. This year’s auction saw nearly double the number of donated items compared to previous years, offering participants a wide range of unique and meaningful pieces to bid on.

Thanks to strong participation and community support, the auction exceeded its fundraising goal, raising more than \$17,000. With Coeur Alaska’s dollar-for-dollar company match, the total impact of the fundraiser will exceed \$34,000. All proceeds directly benefit the Foundation’s Coeur Alaska Kensington Mine Juneau Schools Endowment Fund to support extracurricular programs and enrichment opportunities for Juneau students. Created by Coeur Alaska in 2024 to establish a sustainable funding source for Juneau’s students, the fund made its first allocation in 2025, benefiting twenty-eight Juneau School District extracurricular groups and activities. The endowment will continue to grow and support students for generations.

About Coeur Alaska:

Coeur Alaska's Kensington mine is an underground, hard-rock gold mine located in the Berners Bay Mining District, 45 miles north-northwest of Juneau. Coeur Alaska employs approximately 400 people and is the second-largest employer in the City and Borough of Juneau. Coeur Alaska, Inc. is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Coeur Mining, Inc., a U.S.-based, well-diversified, growing precious metals producer with seven wholly-owned operations: the New Afton gold-copper mine in British Columbia, Canada the Rainy River gold-silver mine in Ontario, Canada, the Las Chispas gold-silver complex in Sonora, Mexico, the Palmarejo gold-silver complex in Chihuahua, Mexico, the Rochester silver-gold mine in Nevada, the Wharf gold mine in South Dakota, and the Kensington gold mine in Alaska. In addition, the Company wholly-owns the Silvertip polymetallic exploration project in British Columbia, Canada.
